Birmingham City Centre

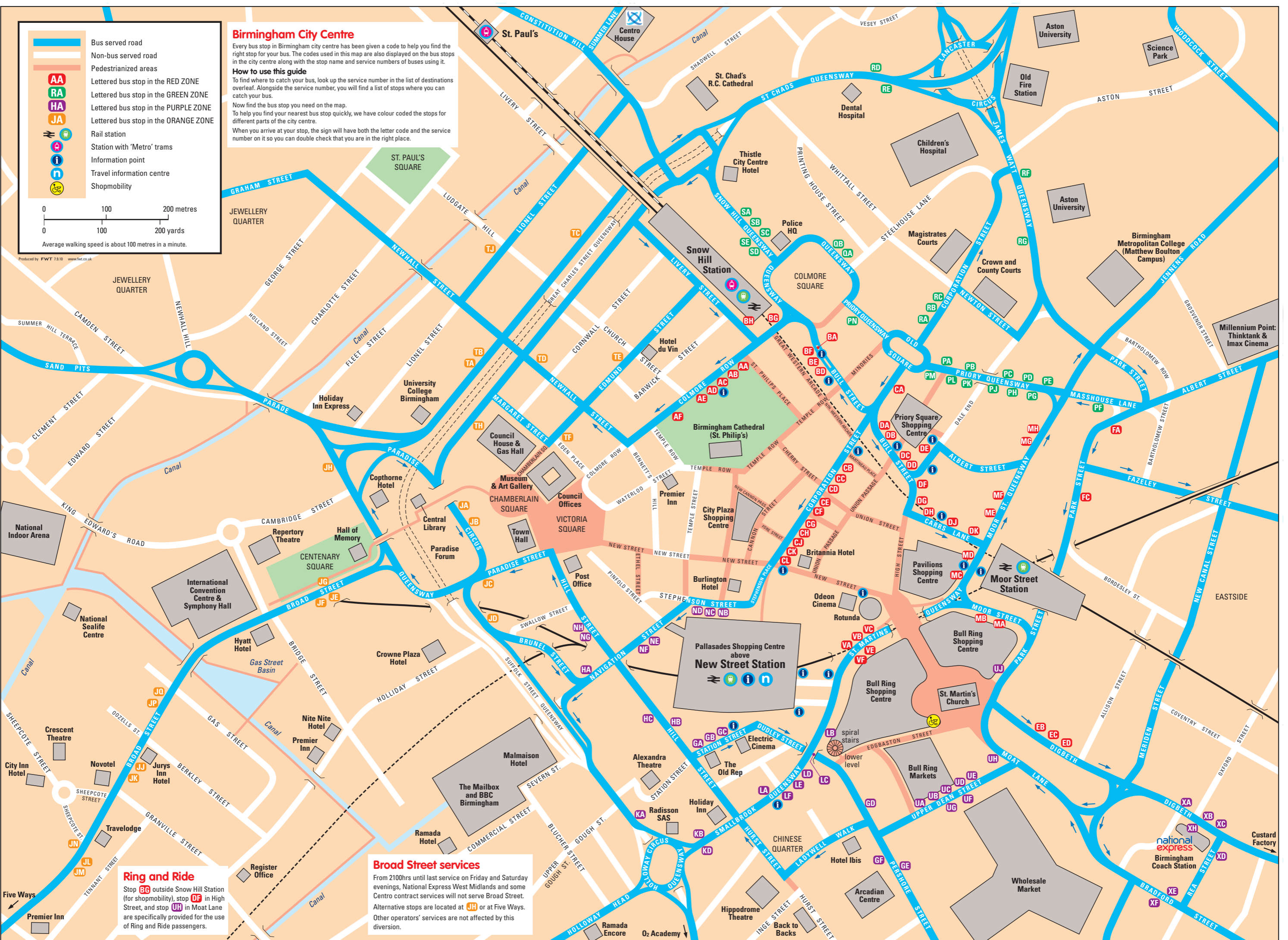
Every bus stop in Birmingham city centre has been given a code to help you find the right stop for your bus. The codes used in this map are also displayed on the bus stops in the city centre along with the stop name and service numbers of buses using it.

How to use this guide

To find where to catch your bus, look up the service number in the list of destinations overleaf. Alongside the service number, you will find a list of stops where you can catch your bus.

Now find the bus stop you need on the map. To help you find your nearest bus stop quickly, we have colour coded the stops for different parts of the city centre.

When you arrive at your stop, the sign will have both the letter code and the service number on it so you can double check that you are in the right place.



Ring and Ride

Stop **8B** outside Snow Hill Station (for shopmobility), stop **8F** in High Street, and stop **8U** in Moat Lane are specifically provided for the use of Ring and Ride passengers.

Broad Street services

From 2100hrs until last service on Friday and Saturday evenings, National Express West Midlands and some Centro contract services will not serve Broad Street. Alternative stops are located at **8H** or at Five Ways. Other operators' services are not affected by this diversion.

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
